

## **Primary Registration Assignment**

**This is your child's first assignment and part of the registration package.** Other than brainstorming and the script, all work should be unedited by the parent. To ensure prompt processing of your child's registration, this needs to be submitted with your child's application.

**Making a picture that tells a story. Space has been provided at the back of this page.**

Suggested script for parents:

Parent: I would like you to create a picture that tells a story about something interesting that you have done or seen. You might be thinking:

"My teacher wants me to make a story about something interesting or about what I saw. Let me see, I saw a moose on the way home from Vancouver! The moose was crossing a creek on the side of the highway. The water was over its knees! I wonder where it was going?"

Parent: Now draw the story using different colours or shapes to show what you saw. You might be thinking:

"I need to think about what I saw. I saw the moose walking in the stream. It was a dark brown and very big! It was up to its knees in water. There were trees on either side of the stream. I don't know where it was going because the trees came right to the edge of the stream. The water was going very fast."

Parent: Remember to use up as much of the white space of the paper as possible. Draw large and include as many details as you can.

### **Kindergarten and Grade One students:**

When their picture is done, ask them if they wish to print their name or label some parts of the picture. Then have your child tell you the story while you scribe below the picture, eg:

"I saw a moose crossing a river. It was wading up to its knees in the water. It was very big!"

### **Grades Two and Three students:**

When their picture is done, students should write two or three sentences telling the story.
